MANDATORY SAFE ENVIRONMENT ONLINE TRAINING FOR ALL THE VOLUNTEERS

Reminder: PLEASE, CHECK your Safe Environment Compliance Certificate Expiration date. Please note that Online Virtus training for many will be expiring within August-Sept-October.

The Eparchy's revised Safe Environment Policy no longer allows for lapses in compliance - either in Virtus training or in background screenings - for ALL OLPH VOLUNTEERS AND EXPLORER YOUTH GROUP LEADERS. Anyone falling out of compliance at any point must immediately cease from their designated area of service at OLPH until such time as they are in compliance once again. No one - not members of the clergy, volunteers, educators, employees etc. - may serve for even one day when out of SEP compliance. Thank you for your vigilance in this matter.

SS Peter and Paul Fast

Fast of SS. Peter and Paul begins on the evening of All Saints and runs until June 28. It is the preparation for the Feast of SS. Peter and Paul (June 29). Along with the Dormition (August 15), Christmas and Easter, this was one of the four times when the devout would receive Holy Communion during the centuries when people refrained from Holy Communion due to misdirected theology. The traditional fast calls for abstinence from meat on Mondays and Wednesday as well as Friday. This Fast is voluntary, and can be followed to whatever degree you wish while preparing for this great feast.

ST. PETER'S FAST is the most recent of our four yearly fasts. It was probably introduced by monks within the last few centuries in memory of the fact that these two apostles strengthened themselves spiritually by fasting. The Church, using the example of these two illustrious saints, prescribes a period of fast immediately before their feasts.

The main focus of almsgiving is to put money aside for Peter's Pence. This is the national collection that is taken up at this time and sent to Pope Francis. The pope uses these donations to fund papal charities, which focus heavily on relief for refugees around the world, support for the family, and aid for Churches in poor countries.

All Saints Sunday by Fr. Chris

All Saints is set on this Sunday to remember all those who have responded to the call of the Holy Spirit, given at Pentecost and to us individually in the Holy Mystery of Chrismation, and who achieved the fullness of the Christian life. This is the day to remember all those anonymous Christians, people who were humble or royal, monks and nuns or parents of children, workers, soldiers, doctors, farmers, specialists: every soul who now dwells in glory in Heaven. These people, from all nations and all ranks of life, see the full Beatific Vision, the revelation of the Holy Trinity. These people, from little children to the very old, responded to the Holy Spirit's action in their lives. They became holy HERE, most of them while living in the ordinary world. Let us pray that we also LISTEN to the Holy Spirit!

And it is important to remember that they do not forget us – they pray for us so that we will have the same blessing. This is the Communion of Saints.

What is the Communion of Saints?

From the Catholic Encyclopedia we read: Repeatedly St. Paul speaks of the one body whose head is Christ (Colossians 1:18), whose energizing principle is charity (Ephesians 4:16), whose members are the saints, not only of this world, but also of the world to come (Ephesians 1:20; Hebrews 12:22). In that communion there is no loss of individuality, yet such an interdependence that the saints are "members one of another" (Romans 12:5), not only sharing the same blessings (1 Corinthians 12:13) and exchanging good offices (1 Corinthians 12:25) and prayers(Ephesians 6:18), but also partaking of the same corporate life, because "Christ holds it together and makes all of its parts work perfectly, as it grows and becomes strong because of charity" (Ephesians 4:16).

Catholic Answers on the Saints hearing our prayers:

"We have no evidence the saints are aware of our prayer requests. How would they even know? They are not omniscient."

We have evidence they are aware of our prayers. You don't have to know everything to know some things, so the saints don't have to be omniscient to be aware of our prayer requests. We do not know much about how human intellect works in heaven, but the fact that **heaven is a higher state than this life suggests we will have more rather than less awareness**. This is also suggested because we will be made "partakers of the divine nature" (2 Pet. 1:4) and **transformed to be like God by virtue of the beatific vision** (1 John 3:2).

Scripture does not give many pictures of what life in heaven is like, but it **shows saints and angels aware of what is happening on earth** (Rev. 6:9–11, 7:13–14, 11:15–18, 16:5–6, 18:20). The common understanding is that the saints are aware of our prayer requests through union with God. It is reasonable to suppose that, in the perfect state of heaven, people will have whatever information is relevant to them. Thus, God can make a saint aware that someone is asking for his intercession.

Scripture indicates that those in heaven are aware of our requests. In Revelation 5:8, the twenty-four elders, who represent the leaders of the people of God in heaven, offer incense to God. We are told that the incense is "the prayers of the saints." In Revelation 8:3–4, an angel offers incense that is mingled with "the prayers of all the saints." At that time, the term "saint" was commonly used to refer to living Christians (2 Cor. 1:1; Eph. 1:1; Phil. 1:1). It is natural to see these passages as depicting the inhabitants of heaven presenting the prayer requests of the saints on earth to God. This is surely part of what 8:3 means by the reference to the prayers of "all the saints"
