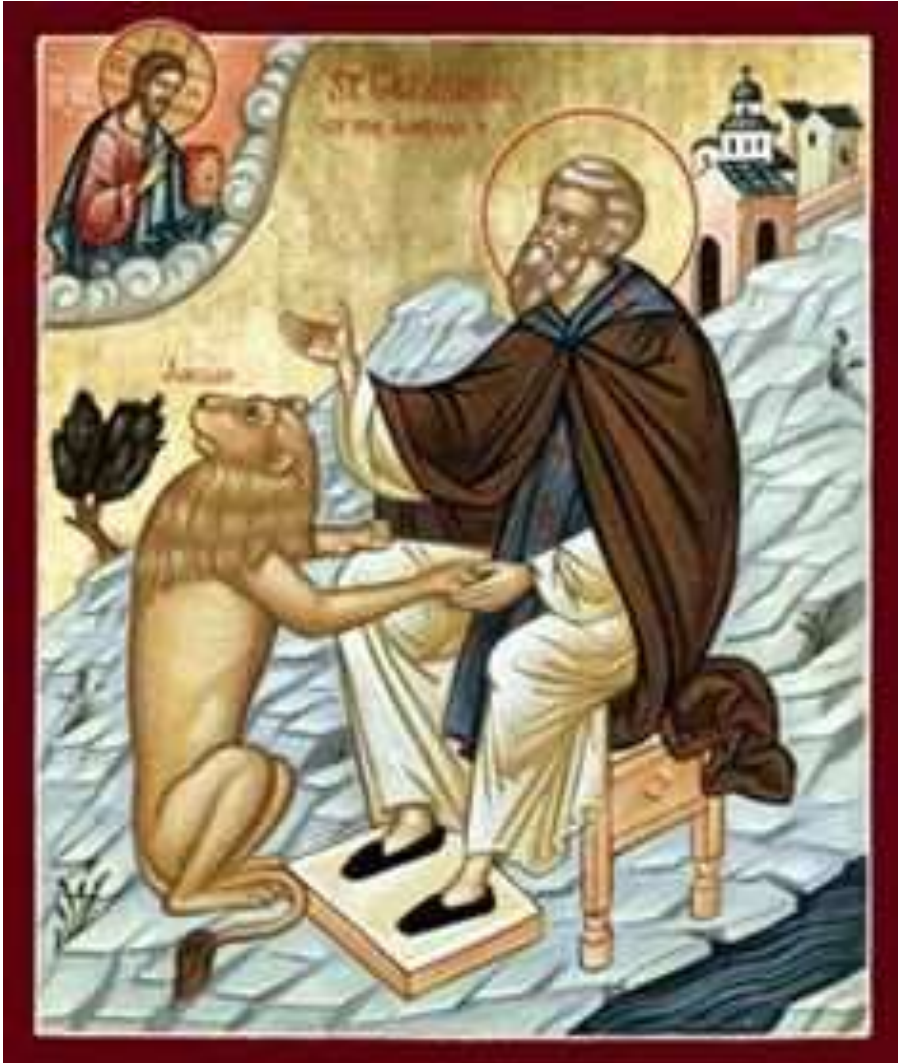

The annual Men’s March for Life will be held June 18, 2016, beginning at Our Lady of Fatima Church in Albuquerque. The March is scheduled to coincide with Father’s Day weekend, with the goal of motivating men to offer their prayers and public witness against abortion. On Sunday, June 19 the Knights of Columbus will be sponsoring renewal of wedding vows for Father’s Day. All married couples will be invited to renew their vows at the divine liturgy. In this time of so many challenges to traditional marriage this is an opportunity for all of us to be reminded of the sacred nature of marriage as a covenant between a married couple and Almighty God, blessed by the Catholic Church.

Saint of the Week -

June 18 - St Jerome, one of the four Latin Doctors of the Church. He translated the entire Bible into Latin, known as the Vulgate, which made it accessible to generations of European readers and is the basis for vernacular translations today. While a student in Rome, he converted to the faith in the 360s, but after a serious illness in 374, he set aside his secular life, studying the scriptures and leading a life of penance.

For over 40 years he would write Latin translations of Greek theologians, commentaries on the Bible, letters of spiritual guidance for consecrated virgins and ordinary laity, and defenses of the true faith against heresies. Once a prominent priest in Rome, he settled at Bethlehem, the ideal location for a man dedicated to the Bible. He is shown often with a lion, which is said to have lived near him in peace, or an owl for his great wisdom.
