**October is traditionally dedicated** to the Mother of God, especially the recitation of the Holy Rosary. ## Saints of the Week

**October 11 - Bl. John XXIII, Pope of Rome.** “Good Pope John” was elected to keep the papacy going after the death of Pius XII, but nothing was really expected of him. The cardinals were shocked at all that he did in his short reign, not only summoning Vatican II to finish the business of Vatican I but opening the windows and starting Catholicism on the path of renewal it continues with Pope Francis today. He had great interest in the Eastern Catholics. While nuncio to Bulgaria he devoted himself to the Byzantine Catholics, who had been driven out of their homes by the Greeks, helping them to find new homes and getting Rome to establish a bishop there in 1926. He embarked on Catholic-Orthodox dialogue when it was something unheard of, wrote out passports for Jews on the order of Pius XII during the War, and supported both Roman and Eastern Catholics behind the Iron Curtain as much as he could. Because Khrushchev had such respect for him, Ukrainian Archbishop and secret cardinal Josef Slipyj was released from the gulags and sent to Rome for the Council. John’s incorrupt body lies in St Peter’s basilica today.

**October 13 is the feast of Our Lady of Fatima** - 100 years ago, a series of apparitions began in which the Virgin Mary appeared to three children in this little town in northern Portugal. World War I was raging, Portugal was ruled by a harsh anti-Catholic dictatorship, and the Bolshevik Revolution was close at hand. Unless the world repented, Mary warned, Russia would unleash a flood of errors upon the world - and indeed Communism still plagues us in China, Cuba, and Indochina, and has left a terrible legacy to modern Russia, Eastern Europe, Latin America, Africa and among foolish people who think that communism just was not done right and it's worth repeating! **October 14 - Fr. Roman Lysko** was ordained in 1941 during the German occupation of western Ukraine. He and his wife remained Greek Catholic after the bishops were arrested in 1945 and after the Soviets declared that the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church no longer existed in 1946. In 1949, Father Lysko was arrested, and he and his wife were "guilty" of the crime of working with teenagers and young adults, and were convicted of "cultivating in them the Catholic Faith, and thus an anti-Soviet spirit." After May 1950 there was no word of him. In 1956 the Soviets rehabilitated him after the Khrushchev "thaw" and said that this healthy young man supposedly died of heart trouble.

After 1991, it was discovered that on October 14, 1949, Father Roman Lysko was killed after over a month of brutal torture at the hands of the Soviet NKVD in the main prison of L'viv, Ukraine. Having failed to break the spirit of this young priest, who knew the 150 Psalms by heart, he was walled up alive, and left to die there. He chanted the psalms, until his voice finally fell silent for all time. He was beatified in 2001 by Pope John Paul II.
