## **Saints of the Week -**

**Jan. 16 - Veneration of the Chains of St. Peter:** these massive memorials of his imprisonment are displayed at the church of San Pietro in Vinculi in Rome. The feast commemorates his willingness to suffer for Christ in order to preach the Gospel, no matter the cost.

**Jan. 18 - SS. Athanasius and Cyril of Alexandria** - these are the two greatest patriarchs of Egypt, whose constancy and orthodoxy in the face of persecution contributed to the development of our understand of Who Jesus Christ is (Christology) as God and Man in one Person, and the role of Our Blessed Lady, the ever-virgin Mary and Mother of God (Theotokos). Unfortunately, Alexandria lapsed into the Monophysite heresy by rejecting the Council of Chalcedon in 451 AD.

**Jan. 21 - St. Agnes** - one of the most popular saints of the diocese of Rome, this virgin martyr is one of the women commemorated in the Roman Canon of the Mass (known today as Eucharistic Prayer 1 in the modern Latin rite). On her feast day, special white lambs are wreathed in flowers and then blessed by the pope. Their wool will be used to make the palliums worn by archbishops. Those palliums are distributed on June 29, the feast of Saints Peter and Paul, to new metropolitans by the pope; recipients have included our metropolitans of Pittsburgh, Prešov (Slovakia), and Nyiregyhaza (Hungary).

### **HOUSE BLESSING: THE PURPOSE**

The annual blessing of homes is a custom of special beauty and significance. We again ask Christ to bless and enter into our homes and our lives. We ask Him to be with us, as we desire to be with Him. We ask that by the sprinkling of blessed water, the Holy Spirit renew us, our families and our lives in our homes. As Christ brought salvation to the house of Zacchaeus; we ask for the same for all dwelling in our homes.

### **HOUSE BLESSING: THE ORDER**

The house being ready, we dress in an honorable manner (as we would for church). When the priest arrives, we greet him at the door, having turned off any radio, TV, or other noise based element. Animals that may cause disruption by being startled by the sprinkling water should be placed out of the way. On a small table before icons, a small but wide-mouthed bowl full of newly blessed water is placed (if you do not have newly blessed Jordan water a priest will bring one from the church). Together with a list of names of those who reside in the home, a lighted candle and censor (if you have one) are also placed on the table. These items are arranged prior to the arrival of the priest. At the beginning of the service for the blessing of the home, a family member leads the priest throughout the home, carrying the lighted candle. The rest of the household follows and then returns to the table for the final prayer and blessing with water upon those present.
