Saints of the Week

October 23—St. James, Brother of God - Aramaic does not have a word for relatives who are cousins, thus the relatives of Jesus from his parents' siblings are always referred to as brother or sister. This has been carried over into English, which obviously causes problems for those not familiar with languages of antiquity, and has resulted in heretics denying that Mary is ever-virgin. Traditionally, he is considered to be the same man as "James, son of Alpheus" (Mark 3:18), This James served as the first bishop of Jerusalem, a position he held until he was martyred by being thrown from the roof of the Temple when he refused to deny that Jesus is the Son of God. Josephus wrote that many Jews believed that God allowed the Temple to be destroyed in 70 AD as punishment for James "who was a just man."

The most ancient surviving Divine Liturgy is called the Liturgy of St. James. This is the liturgical source for all Liturgies used by the East Antiochian tradition: the Orthodox and Catholic Syriac, Malabar, and Malankara Churches of the Near East and India. The popular hymn *Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence* which is sung in our parish comes from this Liturgy.

October 26—St. Demetrius —is the feast of Saint Demetrius, the patron of our own Demetrius Yackanich. On this day, the herds come down from the meadows of the Carpathian Mountains under his protection, having gone up on St. George's Day in April. The church calendar is filled with warrior saints, soldiers who served in the military faithfully but stood up for their Christian faith when necessary. Demetrius was an officer in the Roman army, and belonged to one of Rome's ancient patrician families with the right to speak in the Senate.

He was killed in the last big persecution of Christians under the emperor Diocletian. This persecution was designed to exterminate Christianity completely and it produced about 5,000 martyrs. A successful orator, his speeches led many to convert to Christianity. He was killed by being pierced with spears, around 306 AD, at the famous town of Sirmium, a major Roman city in modern Serbia which had a massive military base. His relics were moved south into modern Greece, to the city of Thessalonika. The relics of St Demetrius have poured out liquid myrrh for over 1,200 years. The liquid has to be collected regularly or else the trough at the base of the shrine would overflow. It is used for anointing the sick, and there have been thousands of miraculous cures.

The icons usually show him as either a soldier in Roman military uniform, or riding a horse and defeating an armed man. This figure is either the Antichrist or a giant named Lyaos, who had been defeated by Saint Nestor after young and poorly armed Nestor invoked "the God of Demetrius."

His protection is invoked against evil spirits, and he is the patron saint of Thessalonica, and of course he is a co-patron of soldiers (along with SS. George and Sebastian).
