

Confession (Mystery of Reconciliation):

9:00—10:00 am on Sundays, before or after weekday Liturgies, or by appointment with Father

Mysteries of Baptism/Chrismation/ Eucharist:

Must be arranged three months in advance. (Pre-Jordan requirement)

Mystery of Crowning:

Must be arranged six months in advance (Pre-Cana requirement)

Sick and Shut-Ins: It is the family's responsibility to notify the parish office when a parishioner is in the hospital or confined to home because of sickness or old age. Father will bring the confined person the Holy Mysteries on a regular basis. It is recommended that one receive the Anointing of the Sick before any major surgery. Please don't let the priest be last to know that someone is ill!

Safe Environment Training Reminder and Update

All OLPH volunteers and Explorer leaders must stay current with Safe Environment compliance. Training and background checks must not lapse. The **updated** Eparchy policy now requires Virtus training every **three years** (not annually). If your certificate has expired or will expire soon, please complete the online training now.

Volunteer Eligibility

To help us care well for one another, those wishing to volunteer, including in the choir, must be registered and active members of OLPH for at least **one year** and complete a **background check** prior to beginning to serve. ROSARY

"It could be said that each mystery of the Holy Rosary, when carefully meditated, sheds light on the mystery of man: 'cast your burden on the Lord and he will sustain you,' as it says in Psalm 55:23. To pray the rosary is to hand over our burdens to the combined merciful hearts of Christ and His Mother. The rosary does indeed 'mark the rhythm of human life', bringing it into the joyful communion of the Holy Trinity, Who is our life's destiny and deepest longing. Through the rosary, the faithful receive abundant graces as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer." (Pope John Paul II)




St John Paul II October 22

Where does one begin with this saint? At his death, one million people from around the world packed Rome's streets chanting "santo subito!" or " Sainthood Now". Born Karol Wojtyla, he had Ukrainian Greek Catholic relatives who familiarized him with the Byzantine Church and Jewish school friends who made him sympathetic to Judaism. While managing the implementation of Vatican II reforms in Poland, he kept traditional practices that helped keep the Church stable. He was a forced laborer under the Nazis while being engaged in underground theater to keep Polish culture alive in its own country where Nazi ideology sought to destroy it.

A secret seminarian, he was ordained when Poland had become Communist. As archbishop of Krakow, he fought the communists for the rights of believers and the Church. When he emerged as Pope in 1978, he encouraged people "Be not afraid" and helped with the overthrow of communism in Eastern Europe by preaching respect for people as being made in the image and likeness of God and being valuable not for their economic output but as children of God. He was a prolific traveler who electrified the crowds who came to see him. He gave witness to the value of a natural and Christian holy death at the same time that Terri Schiavo was legally murdered in America by being denied nutrition so that her husband could remarry.

A son of Poland, his close friend in the Vatican was a German from an anti-Nazi family, Cardinal Josef Ratzinger, who would succeed him. A great theologian and teacher, his Theology of the Body continues to positively affect marriage preparation programs and redeems human sexuality from the corruption of modern sensualism and pornography. He was an amazing pontiff, who wanted above all to pray. John Paul II canonized 111 saints and beatified over 1,000; he himself was beatified in 2011 and canonized in 2014 with John XXIII.



St James Brother of the Lord October 23

This James is known both as "brother of the Lord" and the "son of Alpheus." He is also called **James the Less**, which simply means he was shorter than James the Great. In the oldest surviving Christian liturgy, the Liturgy of Saint James, he is referred to as James of Alpheus.

Church tradition has held that Mary was not only a virgin for the conception of Jesus on March 25th, but that she remained ever-virgin thereafter. The same holds true for St. Joseph. How then can Jesus have a brother? Aramaic had no equivalent word for cousin: everyone was a brother or sister within an extended family. Having carried and given birth to the Son of the Most High, there is no way that Joseph would have even considered fathering children through Our Lady. She was the living Ark of the Covenant, and so untouchable in that way.

James is also known as the Just. He was the first bishop of Jerusalem, having been chosen by SS. Peter, John, and James the Great. Like most of the other apostles, James is said to have died as a martyr, being stoned to death by the Jews, having survived being thrown off the roof of the Temple, in 63 AD. Josephus wrote that the killing of James was lamented by many of the Jewish people, and the Romans' destruction of the temple and city seven years later was seen as divine retribution.
