be expiring within the next 4 to 5 weeks.

longer allows for lapses in compliance - either in
Virtus training or in background screenings - for
ALL OLPH VOLUNTEERS AND EXPLORER
YOUTH GROUP LEADERS. Anyone falling out of
compliance at any point must immediately cease
from their designated area of service at OLPH until
such time as they are in compliance once
again. No one - not members of the clergy, volun-
teers, educators, employees etc. - may serve for
even one day when out of SEP compliance.

October 12: St Martin of Tours

St. Martin as bishop of Tours, in Roman-ruled Gaul (France): feast day October 12.

St. Martin is still a popular saint in East and West. Born in what is now Hungary to a military family, he became a catechumen at the early age of 10 in 326. It was not a popular choice: Christians were a minority in the western empire. As part of his military life, he became a cavalryman, hence the images of him on his faithful horse. He was serving in a cavalry unit near Amiens, in modern France, where the most commonly-known incident of his life took place. At the gates of the city of Amiens he met a scantily clad beggar. He impulsively cut his own military cloak in half and shared it with the freezing man. That night, Martin dreamed of Jesus wearing the half-cloak he had given away. He heard Jesus say to the angels: "Here is Martin, the Roman soldier who is not even baptized; he has warmed me." With that, he decided for baptism at the age of 18. In 336, he became convinced that he could not fight as a soldier and a Christian, and after much debate he was released from the service. He moved to what is now Tours, and became a disciple of St. Hilary of Poitiers, where he adhered to orthodox Christian teaching, not the Arian heresy favored by the advancing barbarians, the imperial court, and many bishops. For a third time, he did not take the popular course. He eventually became an evangelizer, and stories of his deeds have survived in western France to our time! He always returned to his beloved monastery and hermitage, but in 371 he agreed to become the bishop of Tours. He worked fervently against heresy, but always with compassion. He became one of France's most loved saints.

Blessed Roman Lysko

On October 14, 1949, Blessed Roman Lysko was killed after over a month of brutal torture at the hands of the Soviet NKVD in the main prison of L'viv, Ukraine. He and his wife were "guilty" of the crime of working with teenagers and young adults after the Soviets forbade such apostolates, and were convicted of "cultivating in them the Catholic Faith, and thus an anti-Soviet spirit."

Lysko had refused to join the Russian Orthodox Church in 1946. He kept serving at two village churches that remained Greek Catholic, living with his wife and four small children. At his arrest, on false charges of helping anti-Soviet partisans, he was taken from Horodka to L'viv, and imprisoned. Many people heard him chant the psalms, which he knew by heart, through the windows of the prison, as did prisoners inside. Having failed to break the spirit of this young priest, who had persisted in remaining a Ukrainian Greek Catholic four years after the Soviets had suppressed the Church, the police walled him up alive, and left him to die there. He again chanted the psalms, until his voice finally fell silent for all time.

His family did not learn of his fate until 1956, when he was officially rehabilitated "due to lack of proof of any guilt." He was beatified in 2001 by Pope John Paul II.

We have come to Him in raw need and sincerity, and we have witnessed Him answer our prayers, thereby fortifying our Faith and faith. It has been exciting and edifying to experience the love of our Lord and of our Blessed Mother through His Presence, His Word, and His answers to our fervent prayers. The Prayer Warriors is open to women, men, and children, and we welcome your service! Praise God for raising up a group of mighty warriors committed to the belief that through Him, in Him, with Him, and toward Him, prayer moves worlds. Front page icon: 'Miracle of the Sun' SIXTH APPARITION of OUR LADY in Fatima

The “Miracle of the Sun” occurred during the 6th Apparition of Fatima on Oct. 13, 1917, and was witnessed by over 70,000 people in Portugal. Mary appeared in Fatima every month from May to October 1917. She delivered a series of messages during that time to three young children, Lúcia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto.

On October 13th the three children made their way to the Cova amid the adulation and skepticism which had followed them since May. When they arrived they found critics who questioned their veracity and the punctuality of the Lady, who had promised to arrive at noon. It was well past noon by the official time of the country. However, when the sun arrived at its zenith the Lady appeared as she had said she would.

"What do you want of me?"

I want a chapel built here in my honor. I want you to continue saying the Rosary every day. The war will end soon, and the soldiers will return to their homes.

"Yes. Yes."

"Will you tell me your name?"

I am the Lady of the Rosary.

"I have many petitions from many people. Will you grant them?"

Some I shall grant, and others I must deny. People must amend their lives and ask pardon for their sins. They must not offend our Lord any more, for He is already too much offended!

"And is that all you have to ask?"

There is nothing more.

As the Lady of the Rosary rose toward the east she turned the palms of her hands toward the dark sky. While the rain had stopped, dark clouds continued to obscure the sun, which suddenly bursts through them and is seen to be a soft dancing disk of silver and then many colors.

"Look at the sun!"
