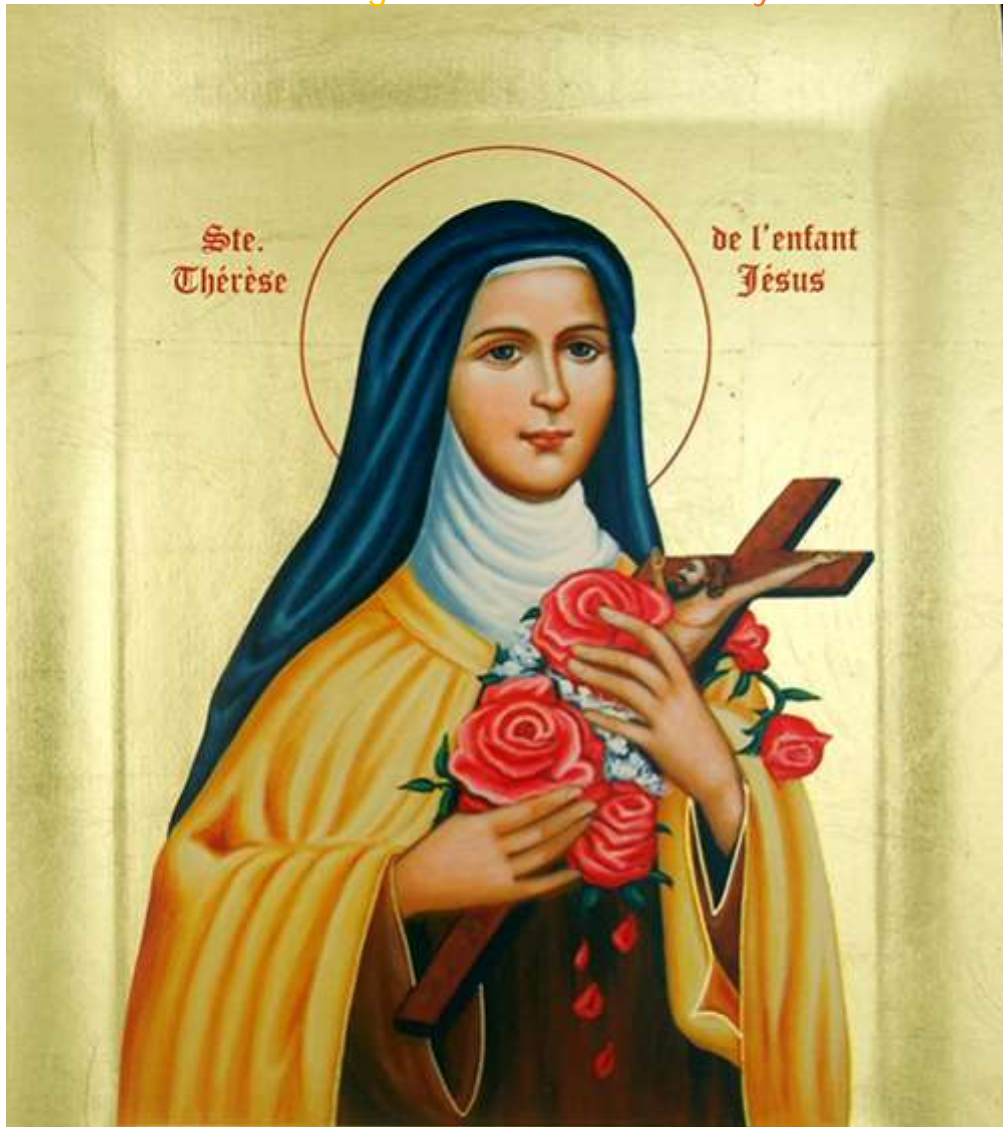

MANDATORY SAFE ENVIRONEMT ONLINE TRAINING FOR ALL THE VOLUNTEERS

Reminder: PLEASE, CHECK your Safe Environment Compliance Certificate Expiration date.

Please note that Online Virtus training for many will be expiring within the next 4 to 5 weeks. The Eparchy's revised Safe Environment Policy no longer allows for lapses in compliance - either in Virtus training or in background screenings - for ALL OLPH VOLUNTEERS AND EXPLORER YOUTH GROUP LEADERS. Anyone falling out of compliance at any point must immediately cease from their designated area of service at OLPH until such time as they are in compliance once again. No one - not members of the clergy, volunteers, educators, employees etc. - may serve for even one day when out of SEP compliance.

St Therese – October 3

Saint Therese of Lisieux is one of four women Doctors of the Church. When she died at the age of 24, some nuns in her monastery wondered what would they write in her obituary. She remains one of the most popular modern saints, whose Little Way continues to draw souls closer to Jesus. Thérèse struggled with scrupulosity and depression, but through it all she maintained a deep and childlike faith in the Father's love for her that would become the cornerstone of her great theological work. She lived in a devout middle-class family of late 19th century France, and all of her sisters became cloistered nuns. She entered the Carmelite monastery of Lisieux in 1888, a house that was dominated by elderly aristocrats disdainful of the middle-class women from Therese's family. She was given the name Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face, as she focused both on Christ's humility as a child and as a prisoner Who suffered for us in His Passion. This has endeared her to many Eastern Christians. The prioress wrote that Therese was not yet 18 but had "the sense of a thirty-year old, the religious perfection of an old and accomplished novice," and that she was a perfect nun.

Under the order of her prioress, Thérèse wrote down her doctrine of faith, *Story of a Soul*. It is this book, which preaches holiness through the ordinary combined with a fearless faith that is total in trust and surrender to God, that would later lead her to become the youngest of all of the Doctors of the Church. "Love proves itself by deeds, so how am I to show my love? Great deeds are forbidden me. The only way I can prove my love is by scattering flowers and these flowers are every little sacrifice, every glance and word, and the doing of the least actions for love." She suffered terribly from tuberculosis, and died in 1897. Her book, emphasizing the love of God, abandonment to His will, simplicity, and trusting in Jesus, remains a best-seller to this day. She was canonized in 1925 in front of half a million people jammed into Saint Peter's Square. She is a patron saint of both France and Russia and co-patron of Catholic missions. Her parents were canonized in 2015.

St Francis of Assisi – October 4

October 4 is the feast of the "*poverello*" the poor man, Francis of Assisi. Saint Francis was famously converted from a life of luxury and wealth to becoming the poorest of Jesus' followers. Radically in love with Christ, a man who could kiss a leper covered with open sores, Francis said that he would bow before a priest instead of an angel, because of what the ministry of a priest brings to the world. An ordained deacon, Francis set Italy ablaze as sons and daughters of leading families gave up everything in order to witness to Christ in absolute poverty: the men wandering the land preaching, the women living in poverty and prayer as the Poor Clare Nuns behind cloister walls. Francis' deep love of Jesus led to him creating the living Nativity scenes, which gave us today's many Christmas cribs, and to embrace Christ Crucified so well that he was given the five wounds to carry in his body. Birds listened to his preaching when people would not, the fierce wolf of Gubbio became a beloved pet of the city, and hearts returned to God in an age of abandonment. Pope Innocent III saw Francis holding up the tottering Church in a dream, and so he gave papal blessing to the creation of the first of the mendicant Orders. The simplicity and passion of Francis appeals to the Eastern Christian mind, and many Orthodox venerate him despite his fervent Catholicism, putting him in the category of "fool for Christ's sake."

Because of their humble witness, the Franciscans were given custody of the Catholic shrines of Jerusalem and Bethlehem by the Muslim rulers, a role they continue to today as the Custody of the Holy Land. *Francis is the patron saint of animals, the environment and ecological studies, against dying alone, those who work with or care for animals, Santa Fe and New Mexico, and of peace.*
