Fill out the slip with the names of the recipients and return by mail or drop them by the parish office no later than Wednesday of Holy Week, March 27th. Bishop Nil will place all these names on the altar at Holy Cross Cathedral in Ukraine & pray for your intentions at the Divine Liturgy on Easter Sunday! Parish LENTEN Retreat with Fr Michael O'Loughlin

Retreat Theme: "EVANGELIZATION - to live the faith of our baptism more openly and to share it more freely. We can only share what we have received; we can hold on to our faith only if it continues to grow. "But if salt loses its taste," Jesus asked, "with what can it be seasoned?

Father Michael O'Loughlin grew up in Albuquerque, NM, the oldest of four sons and one daughter of Bob and Marie O'Loughlin. His family discovered the Byzantine Catholic Church when he was a teenager. He graduated from Franciscan University of Steubenville and is the first priestly vocation from our parish. He was ordained to the holy priesthood on May 25, 2005. He served as pastor of Holy Protection of the Mother of God Byzantine Catholic Church in Denver from 2005-2019 and was transferred to St. Mary of the Holy Protection in Sherman Oaks, California on September 1, 2019.

He is also the founding pastor of the Byzantine Catholic Outreach in Santa Paula, CA. Father Michael is very active in evangelization outreach, ministry to young adults, ministry to the homeless. Currently he serves on the Eparchial Committees for Vocations, Evangelization, and Clergy Personnel. He has a strong devotion to Our Lady of Mariapocs.


