89th Annual Pilgrimage / Theotokos: Loving Protectress of All

The 89th Annual Pilgrimage in honor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help will be held at Mount St. Macrina, Sept. 2 & 3, 2023. This year's theme is Theotokos: Loving Protectress of All.

The Sisters look forward to welcoming Pilgrims from near and far.

Light fare will be available at the Lunch Stand starting on Friday evening. For those arriving early, Compline & Blessing of Water will be held at the Lourdes Grotto on Friday evening. Divine Liturgy will be celebrated on Monday morning, Sept 4, at 9:30 am for those who will stay over on Sunday

Bishop Larry J. Kulick, Bishop of the Diocese of Greensburg, PA, will be the guest homilist. Bishop Kulick was ordained to the episcopacy Feb 11, 2021, at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral by Philadelphia Archbishop Nelson J. Perez, D.D., principal consecrator.

According to the Diocese of Greensburg's website, due to his heritage, Bishop Kulick is active in many Slovak cultural and fraternal organizations locally and nationally. He has been a life member of the First Catholic Slovak Union and has served as chaplain for the George Onda District for more than 25 years.

Other plans include many opportunities for participation in the Divine Liturgy. Also scheduled are Matins, Vespers, Parastas, processions, sacrament of reconciliation, activities for teens and children, and as well as services in honor of the Mother of God.

The Pilgrimage holds the distinction of being the oldest and the largest Byzantine Catholic Pilgrimage in the country.

July 11 / St Olga -

Great Princess Helga (+963) of the ruling family of Kiev-Rus', known in Slavonic as Olga, became the first Christian ruler there. Saint Olga, Equal of the Apostles, brought the Christian community to new heights of importance and popularity in the 10th century. Christianity already had a following in the capital city of Kyiv due to the efforts of Greek missionaries, but none of the Varangian ruling class embraced the Faith until Olga did, in Constantinople itself, in 957, as part of a sincere conversion in which she dramatically changed her life. As the widow of Prince Igor, Olga worked at strengthening the political situation of Kiev in relation to the other Rus' principalities for her son Svyatoslav, and advancing civilization with the introduction of construction in stone and foreign learning. Her establishment of forts throughout the land became the basis of parishes after her introduction of Greek and converted Slav missionaries on a national scale. Olga sought to have her son follow her in the Faith. He would not, but her grandson was baptized, Saint Volodymyr the Great (Vladimir), through whom the Church would finally become a national institution in southern Rus'. Her great- grandchildren are all Saints: Boris and Gleb, Yaroslav the Wise, and Anne of Novgorod. It shows how one person's love for God can affect generations to come.

July 15 / Saint Volodymyr, or Vladimir, the Great

Grandson of Saint Olga and a member of the Varangian dynasty that ruled Kyiv-Rus', he was raised a pagan, but desired to give his people a better religion from one of the other civilizations. He rejected Judaism and Islam, and while he had friendly relations with the Latin Church, he chose Byzantine Christianity as most suited to the Slavic spirituality. In the famous story, his ambassadors wrote that after attending the Divine Liturgy, they did not know if they were still on earth or had been lifted up into heaven.

In 988, he was baptized at Kherson – a name we now know due to the tragic war being fought there - and married the sister of the Byzantine Emperor. The Christian community of Kyiv/ Kiev was augmented by an influx of Greek missionaries, iconographers, teachers, and monks and kept up a vigorous connection with Latin Christendom as well. His grandchildren married into the royal families of Hungary, Norway and the Byzantine Empire, one great-granddaughter married the Holy Roman Emperor; another great-granddaughter became St. Margaret of Scotland.

Vladimir himself underwent a sincere conversion. He led the population of Kiev into a mass baptism in the Dnieper River, abolished the death penalty, put away his many concubines, established a national network of parishes, and presided over an economic expansion. At his death the common people mourned their loss of a compassionate ruler, and acclaimed him as a saint.

Because of his choice, the Byzantine form of Christianity became the foundation of modern Ukraine, Russia, and Belarus, and their Churches. This event took place before the Orthodox-Catholic split, and Rome and Kiev-Rus' remained in communion long after the schism of 1054. Volodymyr is revered as a saint in both Churches, and as the national patron saint of Ukraine. A statue of him, raised in 1853 and holding a Latin cross, overlooks Kyiv today, and is one of the few outdoor religious monuments that survived communism.
